

Pastoral Care Officers

Because the almoners role has grown substantially over recent years, the new care structure was introduced in order to reduce the work load, enabling almoners to allow them to concentrate on home visits where they should aim to visit all brethren and Masonic widows at least four to six times a year.

The role of the pastoral care officer is to work with lodge and chapter almoners in order to focus their support on their clients and to improve their knowledge of the care system.

The Pastoral Care Officer is also responsible for briefing the group officers in his area about any new initiatives or processes introduced in the Province by the care team for the Masonic Charitable Foundation and the West Lancashire Freemasons Charity.
